

There are limited options for taking unfolded bicycles on public transport. Folded bikes may be taken on the Tube, tram, DLR, London Overground and South West Trains services, at any time. Folded bikes may be taken onto buses at the driver's discretion. • Buses, trams, DLR: No unfolded bicycles accepted at any time • Tube and Overground: Unfolded bicycles cannot be taken on the Tube between 0730-0930 and 1600-1900 on weekdays and are

discouraged on London Overground. Outside of these hours, they may be taken on the District and Circle lines and some sections of other Tube lines and London Overground. Visit tfl.gov.uk for details • South Western Trains: Unfolded bicycles cannot be taken on SWT services in peak hours, and space is limited at other times. Visit southwesternrailway.co.uk for details.


